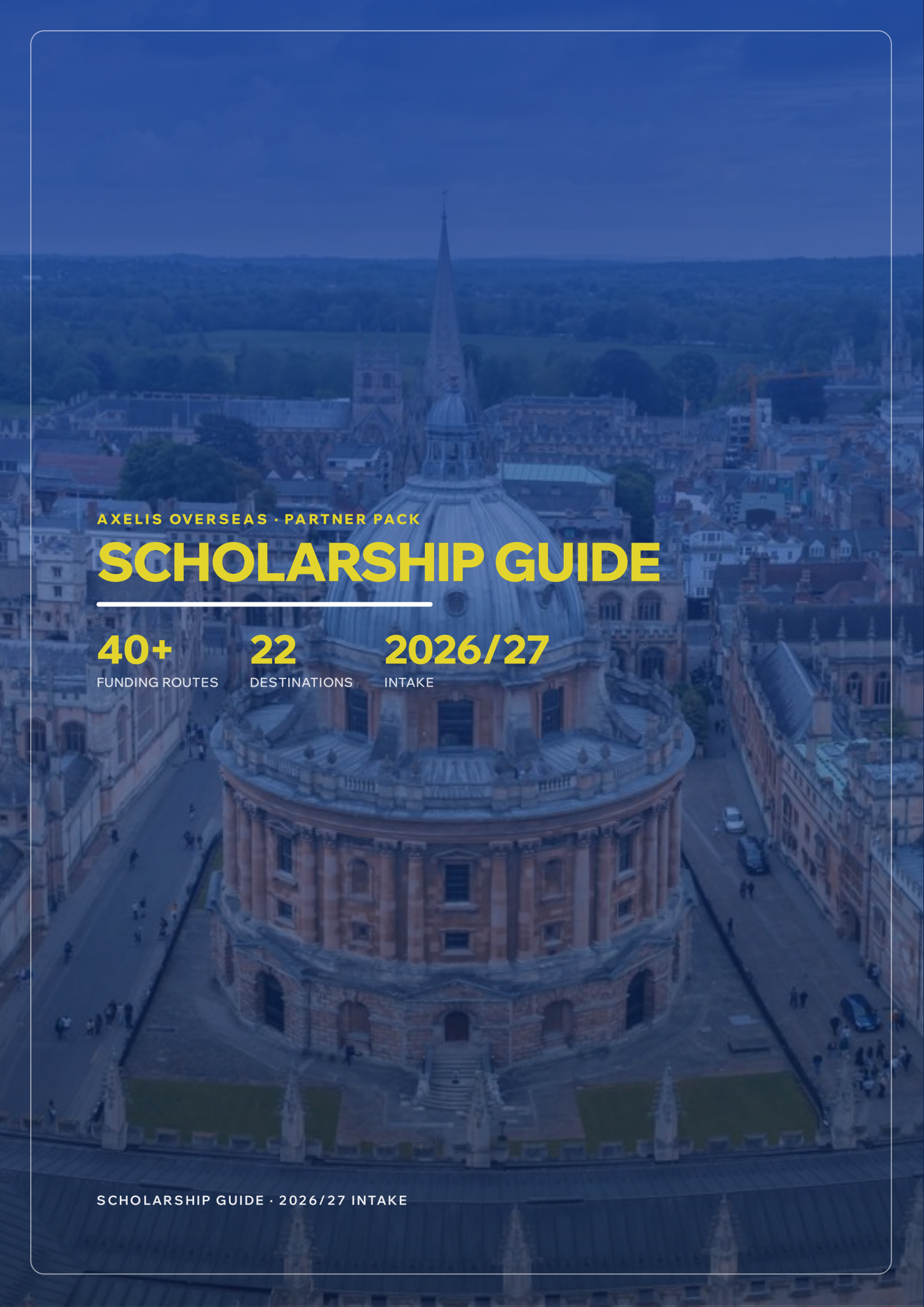

EUROPE · PUBLIC ACCESS

Public and low-fee European destinations, with the **flagship scholarships** students most often use.

Germany

- DAAD scholarships for international students
- Deutschlandstipendium — €300/month merit award
- Erasmus+ mobility grants

France

- Eiffel Excellence Scholarship (PG/PhD)
- Campus France & regional awards
- Erasmus+ grants

Italy

- DSU regional right-to-study grants
- Invest Your Talent in Italy
- University merit scholarships

Poland

- NAWA — Banach & Łukasiewicz programmes

Netherlands (public)

HOW TO WIN FUNDING

Apply early

- Most merit awards are tied to the admission application — apply in the first intake window.
- Government scholarships (Chevening, DAAD, MEXT, CSC) have fixed annual deadlines, often 6–10 months ahead.

Strengthen the profile

- A strong SOP, references and a clear study–career link matter as much as grades.
- Leadership, work experience and community work boost government-scholarship odds.

Stack the sources

- Combine a tuition waiver with a living-cost grant or assistantship.
- Ask each university about faculty, alumni and diversity awards.

Budget realistically

- Scholarships rarely cover 100% — plan for the balance via proof of funds.
- Currency and living costs vary widely; use the per-country brochures.

PARTNER TIP

Pair this guide with the matching country brochure when advising a student — every brochure has a scholarships page specific to that destination.



Scholarships can cut cost by **10–100%** — apply in the first intake window.

Scholarship names, amounts and deadlines change each cycle. Always confirm against the official awarding body before advising a student.
